Beloved: Children of the Holocaust is a collection of 27 portraits drawn in 2017 by Mary Burkett at her kitchen table in West Columbia, South Carolina. These smallest of victims have spoken powerfully to the hearts and minds of countless viewers about the dignity of human life and our responsibility to our fellow man. They have been recognized in the Congressional Record by the United States House of Representatives and have been described by Israeli Ambassador Ron Dermer as "a light in the darkness". They are named the Beloved in recognition that we are all beloved children of God.
